Resolution of the FORT APACHE INDIAN RESOLUTION RESOLUTION WHITERWER. FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is presented with numerous complaints from community representatives concerning the operation of the "Apache Flame" by the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the extensive criticism was discussed with the Council by parent groups, relatives, friends, church leaders, community workers and other persons deeply concerned with problems arising from the abuse of alcohol, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council seriously reviewed the comments offered by such individuals and advised that a petition with over one thousand signatures requests that the Apache Flame be closed in order to deal with the problems of minors' consumption, child abuse and neglect, broken homes and marriages, deaths from exposure, the impact of teenagers, assaults and other criminal violations, arising out of the uncontrolled use of alcohol at the Apache Flame, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that there are justifying reasons to close the Apache Flame, indefinitely, which outbalance any economic interests of the tribe in the sale of alcohol there, at this time.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby directs the White Mountain Apache
 Enterprise to forthwith close all bar operations of the
 Apache Flame, to place the employees thereof in a lay-off
 status, to absorb any inventory of such bar operation
 within the other business operations of the Enterprise,
 and to take all such further appropriate actions as are
 necessary to carry out the intentions of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on May 02, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
