- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, through its Overall Economic Development Program, is actively promoting economic development and community improvements so as to increase employment and provide better living standards for its people, and
- WHEREAS, the use of excess Federal property has contributed greatly to the success of past and present economic development and community improvement projects on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration Excess Property Program, which is vitally important to the Tribal development program was suspended in December, 1978, and
- WHEREAS, a coordinated movement is underway among at least thirty (30) other Indian Tribes in support of renewing the EDA Excess Property Program.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby strongly supports the combined efforts of other Indian Tribes in renewing the Federal Excess Property program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and directed to advise the Arizona Congressional Delegation and EDA of the substance and intent of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 06, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
