RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised and informed that various Congressional Committees and Congressmen are acting so as to cut back the proposed HUD Budget for Fiscal Year 1980-81, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered the extreme importance of adequate funding in any HUD Budget which provides for Indian Health Services, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache people are particularly affected by any budget cutbacks which directly limit Indian Health Services on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman is hereby directed and authorized to contact all the Arizona Congressional Delegation and appropriate Congressional Committee members to assert the position of the Tribe in protesting cutbacks in the Fiscal Year 1980-81 HUD Program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 07, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
