RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the health care improvement has been identified as a high priority by the White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, the ongoing assessment of health care needs and the planning and development of effective program activities to overcome these unmet needs is mandated by the Tribal Council to the Tribal Health Authority in Resolution No. 78-03, and
- WHEREAS, the Federal Government has required, through Public Law 94-437 and Public Law 95-626, the development of comprehensive health plans for Indian communities to cover the period 1981-84, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe entered into a contract with the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service for the revision of the existing 1978 Tribal Health Plan to meet the tribal specific health plan guidelines mandated by Public Law 94-437, and
- WHEREAS, the proposed comprehensive Tribal Health Plan for 1981-84 has been approved by the Health Advisory Board of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on June 18, 1979.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves and endorses the proposed comprehensive Tribal Health Plan for 1981-84 as the official Health Plan of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on July 10, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
