## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that there has developed over 89,000 acres of slash from logging, thinning and from natural resources, which need to be reduced, and
- WHEREAS, Burning Plans have been developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Forestry which includes the burning of Fort Apache Timber Company's logging slash, thinning slash and naturally developed slash, and
- WHEREAS, these Burning Plans have been reviewed by the Forestry Committee and they recommend that they be implemented.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe recommends that these Burning Plans as developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Forestry be carried out.

The foregoing resolution was on September 05, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
