## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that there has been an experimental change in work scheduling for federal government employees whereby employees work four, ten-hour days per week, and
- WHEREAS, with the long travel distances that the Tribal Forestry crews travel daily to get to their work sites, such new work scheduled may prove to be more cost efficient from a work standpoint, and in addition could reduce gas consumption by 25%, and
- WHEREAS, this experimental work schedule would not be mandatory for the Forestry crews but will be initiated on a volunteer basis.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that an experimental change in work schedules to four, ten-hour days be undertaken by the Federal Government for reservation forestry crews.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Federal Government approves this experiment, Tribal Forestry employees volunteering for such work experiment shall work under the same overtime provisions and work schedules as Federal employees.

The foregoing resolution was on September 05, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
