

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council in January 1974 established new Grazing Fees of six dollars (\$6.00) per head per year, and

WHEREAS, due to the livestock hardship and poor market during the month of May 1975, the Grazing Fee for the remainder of 1975 was reduced to the original fee of two dollars (\$2.00) per head, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the happenings of the Livestock Industry and desire to maintain the two dollar (\$2.00) fee for the next five (5) years.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Grazing Fee for the grazing years of 1980, 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1984 remain at the present two dollars (\$2.00) per animal unit.

The foregoing resolution was on November 08, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
