

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been presented with information by the Indian Health Service on a water flouridation program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Community Health Representative Program and the Indian Health Service recommends to the Tribal Council the use of water flouida-tion for the purpose of bettering dental health of tribal members on the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has thoroughly discussed all aspects of such a program, and finds that its initiation will serve the best interests of the tribal members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes a water flouridation program, through the Indian Health Service, as presented to the Tribal Council, and for the purpose of bettering dental health of tribal members on the Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on February 06, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
