

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe (by Council Resolution No. 79-111 of June 7, 1979) entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Indian Health Service to make a cash contribution of \$63,000 in matching funds toward the construction of a sewage system designed to serve the Indian Pine area of the reservation; said area to include the Hondah commercial center, mobile home park, and the Cooley Lake Estates subdivision occupied at present by six (6) Mutual Help homes under construction by the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority (Project No. AZ-1628), and

WHEREAS, because of delays in funding the Tribal contribution to the project, completion of the six Mutual Help houses is likely to be delayed for up to several months resulting in substantial increases in cost for completion of the houses and the sewage system.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby re-affirms the Memorandum of Agreement of June 7, 1979.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman to take immediate action to negotiate grant funding from the Four Corners Regional Commission (FCRC), or any other Federal funding sources in the amount of \$63,000.00 for the purpose of providing matching funds in said amount pursuant to such agreement.


The foregoing resolution was on February 07, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
