

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed that the twentieth United States Decennial Census of Population and Housing will be conducted beginning on April 1, 1980, and
- WHEREAS, the upcoming 1980 Decennial Census will affect the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the information collected in the census may serve many useful purposes, among which are apportionment of representation in Congress and other legislative bodies, and measurement of the economic well-being of the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation and tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, billions of dollars are allocated by Congress annually based on Census Data for programs which provide services to the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the accuracy and completeness of the Census for the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation will determine its population rank among other communities of the country, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Census Data on each individual is held confidential under Census Laws.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it supports and endorses the full participation of all Tribal members in the 1980 Census in order to obtain a complete and accurate census count, and subject to all restrictions on confidentiality.

The foregoing resolution was on March 05, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
