

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has reviewed and considered a proposal to create a Tribal Boundary Patrol as a separate department of the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has further considered the transfer of Isaac Kasey and Cosay Reidhead from their tribal positions in the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to such new Tribal Boundary Patrol Department, in order to more satisfactorily utilize their respective skills and experience in such new positions, and

WHEREAS, aspects of interest to both the Law and Order Committee and the boundary fence project are involved in said new patrol program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the new creation of a Tribal Boundary Patrol Department as a separate department of the Central Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Isaac Kasey and Cosay Reidhead are hereby transferred from their tribal employment with the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to such new department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Lafe Altaha, Chairman of the Law and Order Committee and Raymus Albert, Director of the Tribal Boundary Fence Project, are hereby directed to supervise the creation and operation of said Tribal Boundary Patrol Department, including the salaries, job descriptions and job assignments of the foregoing employees, in consultation with them.

The foregoing resolution was on March 18, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
