

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has previously authorized archaeological research by the University of Arizona Archaeological Field School at Grasshopper on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Field School has requested further authorization to continue the excavations characterized over the past 17 years' work and the site-location surveys for management and planning begun in 1978; and

WHEREAS, said research work for 1980 shall be undertaken pursuant to the federal "Antiquities Act," and a new policy of minimizing disturbance to human burial remains; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed and reviewed its concerns over said program with the Field School Director.

BE IT RESOVLED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the continuation of the University of Arizona Archaeological Field School at Grasshopper on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation under the terms, conditions or understandings presented to it by letter dated April 30, 1980 and at its meeting herein.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman to sign any and all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.


The foregoing resolution was on May 27, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(h) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
