

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, a tribal member, Mrs. Sally (Wool) Gregg has presented to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe information regarding her request to the North Fork Livestock Association for the return of the use of certain lands from within the association's district, and


WHEREAS, Mrs. Gregg has told the Tribal Council that said certain lands originally were held by her father as a holding pasture for livestock and that she has requested the Board of Directors of the Association to return its use to her for the purposes of a homestead, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further informed that said land is not currently being used for other purposes by the Association, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it in the best interests of its tribal members that all due and fair consideration in their requests including the one above referenced, be given to them.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the rights of Mrs. Sally (Wool) Gregg to be given the opportunity by the North Fork Livestock Association to fully present her request, as herein described, and to be given all due and proper consideration in granting her request as described to the Tribal Council.


