

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs Agency Superintendent that inquiry has been made by a private party as to what tribal action, if any, will be taken with respect to the McNary Cemetary, if the lessee or sublessee moves from the premises, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, advises that it is not the custom of the tribe to disturb burial grounds of any kind or for any reason, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports the idea of having the McNary Cemetary fenced off for the purposes of proper demarcation for time immemorial, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that it is the obligation of the lessee, or its sublessee, to undertake such action, with all due respect for the purposes of such a cemetary maintained on the leasehold.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Agency Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to notify the lessee of the McNary townsite to fence the McNary Cemetary in due respect of all the persons buried there.


The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
