RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised and aware of recent employment rights cases instituted against Pinetop Logging under the Tribal Employment Rights Office; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned and interested in the general relationship of such company to tribal members, while such company is authorized to do business on the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal.Council finds that it is in the best interests of the Tribe and its business operations that open communication between it and Pinetop Logging be supported, in advance of further problems or complaints.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Employment
 Rights Office to direct, on its behalf, the attendance
 of a Mr. Gary Loveness, or any additional representatives,
 of Pinetop Logging at the next regularly scheduled Tribal
 Council meeting.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
