

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is grantee for a Regional Sewer Collector System funded by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Indian Health Service in the amount of \$7,800,000; said project to begin construction in December, 1981; and

WHEREAS, EPA regulations for future grants have been amended to require that the grantee:

1. Must have a formal plan for conservation of water in existing and planned residential areas; and
2. Must have an operational Water Quality Management Plan;

Otherwise, grant applications for funding water, sewer and other systems will not be accepted by EPA; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a great and growing need for future funding support from EPA, IHS and other Federal sources to provide necessary water and sanitation systems on the reservation, and is presently implementing an EPA 208 Water Quality Management Plan;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby approves the development of a formal Water Conservation Plan for the reservation, to include:

1. Specifications on new housing construction requiring the use of reduced-flow shower heads and other water-conservation design criteria presently in use elsewhere in new construction;
2. A program of water system repair and maintenance for existing dwellings and other buildings, to include leaky faucets, leaky pipe connections, and other faulty hardware; said program to be coordinated by the Tribal Utility Authority with the advisory assistance of the IHS Environmental Health Office; and
3. Such other water conservation measures as may be recommended by IHS, the Tribal Utility Authority and other professional sources; and



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Utility Authority, in coordination with IHS Environmental Health, be requested to develop a formal Water Conservation Plan to be submitted to the Tribal Council by September 1, 1980; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Utility Authority be designated as executive agent to carry out an approved plan.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
