

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Indian Pine - McNary area of the reservation is rapidly increasing in population and business activity; and

WHEREAS, the sewer system at Indian Pine is (and has been for some years) totally inadequate to handle the existing volume of wastes from the Hondah and Indian Pine area, resulting in massive pollution of Cooley and Bootleg Lakes and their watershed; and

WHEREAS, the McNary sanitation system has for some years caused serious pollution of Goose Creek and the North Fork White River;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby directs that a study be made, under EPA procedures, to produce a comprehensive plan for a regional sewer system to serve the McNary-Indian Pine area to at least the year 2000; PROVIDED that such plan shall be developed in a modular fashion, giving first priority to existing problems in the Indian Pine area; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Utility Authority is designated as executive agent for this project, to coordinate with IHS Environmental Health in technical matters and with the Apache Planning Office in matters of grant funding and administration.


The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
