FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that there is over 100,000 acres of slash from logging, thinning and natural buildup, which needs to be reduced, and


WHEREAS, Burning Plans have been developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Forestry, which includes burning Fort Apache Timber Company's logging slash, thinning slash, and naturally developed slash, and

WHEREAS, these 1980 Burning Plans have been reviewed by the Forestry Committee and they recommend that said 1980 Burning Plans be implemented.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the 1980 Prescribed Burning Plan be approved.

The foregoing resolution was on August 26, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
