

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a road and bridge to serve the new Tribal Fairgrounds, and

WHEREAS, new access from the Seven-Mile/Fort Apache Road will also serve as access to the Fort Apache Timber Company Mill and prevent log-truck traffic on the Stago Crossing, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has staked three proposed lines from the Fairgrounds entrance to the Seven-Mile/Fort Apache Road, and


WHEREAS, the National Park Service Western Archaeological Center, in Tucson, has cleared one such proposed line.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe agrees on this line and grants the Bureau of Indian Affairs permission to survey this line, including required surveys for the bridge.

The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
