

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe created the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation, and

WHEREAS, the Corporation Board of Directors has requested financial assistance from the Tribe for initiation and acceptance of a training program, including the training of approximately seven (7) persons in the Radio Broadcasting, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council reviewed and considered this request and finds that it is in the interest of the Tribe and tribal members to institute such a training program so that the proposed radio operations can be undertaken by tribal-members employees, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is informed that Tribal Government Improvement grant funds may be utilized for this purpose for a three-year program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs and authorizes the submittal of a grant proposal in the amount of \$115,947.00, from fiscal year 1981, Tribal Government grant funds a 93-638 grant, for the purposes hereinabove described.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the radio project be funded from the Tribal Government grant funds for fiscal years 1982, and 1983.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 80-248 is hereby amended in accordance with this Resolution.


The foregoing resolution was on October 01, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
