

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new paved road along the present alignment of Route 460, from Route 46 near Fort Apache Bridge to the Canyon Day Stockman's residence, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the beginning of the project Route 46, 100 feet in width and 2.498 miles in length.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.


The foregoing resolution was on October 01, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
