

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a valuable resource in timber and rangeland that is threatened every year with wild fire; and


WHEREAS, effective suppression activities are contingent on a well-prepared fire plan; and

WHEREAS, such a plan, The Normal Year Fire Plan, has been developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Forestry, and this plan has been discussed by the Forestry Committee and the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe endorses the Normal Year Fire Plan as developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
