



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised; and
- WHEREAS, that the residences of the new Rainbow City subdivision have no television reception because a mountain blocks the present television transmission antenna; and
- WHEREAS, the people of Rainbow City have requested the assistance of the Tribal Council in obtaining another television antenna or other appropriate means to obtain television reception; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to help the Rainbow City residences in this matter.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Chairman to contact or correspond with Mr. Don Weiss, an Engineer employed locally, for the purpose of determining the feasibility and alternatives of the television reception problems of the Rainbow City subdivision.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
