RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 161.22 Rights-of-way requires that service line agreements be approved by the Tribal Governing Body before any work by the applicant may be undertaken for the construction of telephone, electric power, water and gas lines and other utilities across tribal land, and
- WHEREAS, many tribal members are obtaining new homes and other tribal entities are expanding their operations which require utility services, and
- WHEREAS, if each application is to be presented to the Tribal Council for approval, the construction of such service lines could be delayed for several weeks.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in order to expedite the approval of construction of electric power, telephone, water and gas lines to users of tribal land on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, the Tribal Chairman and/or his authorized representative is hereby authorized and directed to execute service line agreements on behalf of the Tribal Council, provided, the distance of such service lines do not exceed 1,000 feet.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when the distance exceeds 1,000 feet, the applicant shall submit an application for a right-of-way, which shall be presented to the Tribal Council for approval.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 80-262 is hereby rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on January 07, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
