RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has discussed the CSA Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) and its relation to the energy needs of the poor and near poor on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to apply for funding for the Energy Crisis Intervention Program from CSA.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman is authorized and directed to prepare and submit a proposal for the Energy Crisis Intervention Program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is further authorized by the Tribal Council to take all actions required to complete the application for the Energy Crisis Intervention Program, and to renew the application each and every year thereafter.

The foregoing resolution was on January 08, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
