

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new bridge over the lower Bonito Creek Crossing of the ID Ranch Road, Route 71, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way 120 feet in width, a distance of 0.084 miles, 150 feet in width, a distance of 0.115 miles and 170 feet in width, a distance of 0.022 miles for a total distance, including the new bridge, of 0.221 miles over a new line upstream of the old bridge. This is according to Right-of-Way drawing FA-71-1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is also requested to improve the approaches on either side of Bonito Creek Crossing to eliminate the hazardous conditions currently existing for safety reasons.

The foregoing resolution was on February 17, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
