## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by Mrs. Rebecca Kane, daughter of Mrs. Dora (Baha) Way, that the house which her mother lives in is in great need of repair and is overcrowded with thirteen (13) family members residing therein; due to the fact that her adult children's applications for housing in the various housing programs have been denied, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that Mrs. Dora Way is an elderly widow who is crippled and needs help and is unable to repair her home which, at this time, is in great need of repair and inadequate to house her family, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes her great need and the need of her family for adequate housing, and further recognizes that because Mrs. Dora Way has never requested assistance from the Tribal Council that her request is timely and appropriate.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mrs. Dora Way's request be recognized for remodelling and repair work on her house, that an additional needed room be constructed and that plumbing be updated in the house and; that the home be repainted so as to provide a comfortable dwelling place for herself and her family.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that her adult children be referred to and encouraged to make applications for other housing through the existing housing programs on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on April 01, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
