RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Chief of Police, requested the Arizona Department of Transportation do a comprehensive traffic study through the community of Whiteriver, and
- WHEREAS, the study was to evaluate pedestrian and motorist safety on this section of roadway, and to develop guidelines for a comprehensive safety program in Whiteriver, and
- WHEREAS, the study was presented to the Tribal Council and the Tribal Council approves all conditions of the study, to make conditions safer through Whiteriver.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it wishes to proceed with the items, listed in the study, when approved by the Chief of Police, and the Tribal Roads Committee.

The foregoing resolution was on April 3, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
