RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has previously recognized alcoholism and alcohol abuse as the major health problem of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has previously demonstrated its support through Tribal Resolution No. 79-16 and operating monies, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Non-Medical Detoxification Program has demonstrated its usefulness to the community as a treatment facility and serves as a focal point for the community response and energy toward fighting alcoholism and alcohol abuse, and
- WHEREAS, the program has every indication of the possibility for success despite extreme limitations of staffing, and
- WHEREAS, the Program is the only local residential alcoholism treatment facility available to the White Mountain Apaches.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it once again voice its support of the Non-Medical Detoxification Program and urge that it continue in its present format.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe request that the Indian Health Services funding of the program continue at the same time or increased rate of expenditure for the upcoming contract year beginning June 01, 1981.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the Authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
