RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has previously recognized alcoholism and alcohol abuse as the major health problem of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Resolution No. 79-16, and
- WHEREAS, one of the most devastating consequences of alcoholism and alcohol abuse is the irreversible effects on an unborn child as a result of a mother's drinking the Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, and
- WHEREAS, the Fetal Alcohol Syndrome is completely preventable.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorse the philosophy, background and intent of the proposal entitled "Pregnancy and Health Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Prevention Project" by Dr. Timothy Mueller and Mr. Te Secondine of the Alcoholism Program.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe urge that the proposal be reviewed, adopted and funded for Fiscal Year 1982 by the Indian Health Service Research Committee and be funded on a continuing basis.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
