RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is of the opinion that the acquisition of a law library is important to the Tribe's goal of self-determination, self-government, and the administration of justice, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by the Tribal Attorney that Tucson Attorney, Michael Brown, who has just been appointed as Judge of the Superior Court of Pima County, is willing to sell to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, several sets of law books totalling over one thousand volumes and valued at approximately \$21,000.00, for the price of \$13,700.00, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that there are monies available for the purchase of the law library from Revenue Sharing Funds.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Attorney be directed to arrange for the purchase and to purchase the aforedescribed law library for a price not greater than \$13,700.00 for the purposes described above.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29g 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
