RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by prior resolution had authorized the Boys' Dormitory at Theodore Roosevelt Boarding School to be used as a Juvenile Detention Home, and
- WHEREAS, Judge Kay Lewis has advised the council that the Boys' Dormitory is too large for the purpose of being used as a Juvenile Detention Home, and
- WHEREAS, Judge Lewis has suggested that the old Club Building next to the Boys' Dormitory at the Theodore Roosevelt School grounds would be a more appropriate and suitable building for a Juvenile Detention Home.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it agrees with Judge Lewis and rescinds its prior resolution and further designates the old Club Building as the site and building to be used as a Juvenile Detention Home.

The foregoing resolution was on August 6, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
