


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is over 120,000 acres of slash from logging, thinning and natural buildup, which needs to be reduced, and
- WHEREAS, Burning Plans have been developed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Forestry, which includes burning Fort Apache Timber Company's logging slash, thinning slash, and naturally developed slash, and
- WHEREAS, the 1981 Burning Plans have been reviewed by the Forestry Committee and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Forestry.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the 1981 Fall Burning Plan be implemented.

The foregoing resolution was on September 10, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
