## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Grievance Committee of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is composed of five (5) White Mountain Apache Tribal employees appointed by the Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed that recent grievance hearings have involved several complex legal issues, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to assure fair and equitable treatment to all employees of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to provide legal expertise to the Grievance Committee on an-as-needed basis, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered appointing Joseph Hessinger as a non-voting advisor to the Grievance Committee for the purpose of providing legal advice and research on pertinent employment laws and issues.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Joseph Hessinger be appointed to serve as legal advisor to the Grievance Committee without compensation, but only as a volunteer legal counsel.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in this capacity, Joseph Hessinger will only advise and do proper legal research and at no time will he vote or represent either party at the Grievance Committee hearing.

The foregoing resolution was on December 03, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
