

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a verbal report by Dr. Robinson, a geologist consultant, working for the Tribe for the purpose of advising the Tribal Council as to the geological advantage and disadvantages of potential dam sites on the Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has previously decided that the Post Office Canyon area was the most feasible site at this time based on various considerations for the location of a dam site; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Robinson has advised the Tribal Council that test bores must be made immediately to determine the geological feasibility at that location and the Tribal Council has concluded that such test bores should be made as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Robinson has advised the Tribal Council that an access road must be constructed in order to complete the drill testing of the dam site.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the immediate testing of the Post Office Canyon dam site to determine the geological feasibility of constructing a dam there.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an access road be constructed as soon as possible so that drilling apparatus can be brought to the necessary areas for test bores.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1982, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section (f,h,i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
