WHEREAS, Chief Police Reno Johnson has come before the Tribal Council and advised the Tribal Council of the events giving rise to the gunshot injuries suffered by Mr. Ralph Lupe, Sr. in the performance of his police duties, and


WHEREAS, Mr. Ralph Lupe, Sr. should be commended for his meritorious performance and exemplary courage which he exhibited after becoming wounded in the performance of his police duties in the protection of the property of tribal people, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is greatly concerned about his injuries and wishes it to be made personally to him that they wish him a quick recovery and are unanimous in their vote of confidence for him and look forward to his return to his regular duties.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it unanimously commends Mr. Ralph Lupe, Sr. for meritorious performance while on duty and for the exemplary courage he exhibited while protecting the property of the tribal people.

The foregoing resolution was on March 04, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
