

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, it is customary for the White Mountain Apache People to swim and otherwise utilize the waters of the White River; and


WHEREAS, in the summer months certain areas of the White River and its tributaries can be polluted and be a source of disease.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that those areas of the river suspected of being polluted will be posted in appropriate locations with signs which read:

WARNING
RIVER WATER UNSAFE
DO NOT SWIM OR DRINK

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V. Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 19, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
