RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to express its sincere appreciation to the Staff of the Project Apache Program for the highly effective maternal and child health services provided the White Mountain Apache Tribe for many years, and
- WHEREAS, in the early years of 1970, there was an excessive infant mortality rate on the reservation and Project Apache steadily reduced that rate to the point where the infant mortality rate on the reservation is comparable to the National rate, and
- WHEREAS, over the years, Project Apache has demonstrated that the provisions of quality maternal and child health services can produce dramatic improvements in the health and well-being of Apache Mothers and Infants, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to recognize and honor employees for their honest, loyal, good and faithful services performed for the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it is hereby grateful for the dedicated professional services that Project Apache provided and exemplified.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that Ms. Nancy Hardcastle, Director, and the Staff of Project Apache, both present and past, are to be commended for their valuable accomplishments that will be long remembered, cherished and appreciated.

The foregoing resolution was on July 08, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
