## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Reservation Salvage II Timber Sale Contract was approved on November 8, 1979, for 30 million board feet of logs; and
- WHEREAS, the Reservation Salvage II Timber Sale was to exist for five years to allow the Fort Apache Timber Company to salvage dying timber where needed; and
- WHEREAS, the large outbreak of the spruce bark beetle has made it necessary to cut 29.5 million board feet of salvage to date; and
- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company has agreed to salvage about 10 million board feet of spruce trees a year until the current infestation has subsided.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the White Mountain Apache Tribe agrees to modify the volume of the Reservation Salvage II Timber Sale Contract from 30 million board feet to 75 million board feet.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
