



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Billy Kane, Director of the Human Service Center, has advised the Tribal Council that the Inter-Mountain Board of Education has decided to contract pursuant to P.L. 638 to operate the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School which is a highschool formerly under the authority of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and
- WHEREAS, approximately sixty-five (65) students from the White Mountain Apache Tribe are attending or will attend the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advised that the thirty-three (33) tribes support the decision of the Board of Education of the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School to enter into a 638 contract to operate the school, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that in the interest of self-determination the White Mountain Apache Tribe should support the decision of the School Board to contract pursuant to P.L. 638 to operate the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the decision of the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School Board of Education to enter into a 638 contract to manage and operate the Inter-Mountain Inter-Tribal School for the benefit of the Indian people.

The foregoing resolution was on August 11, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
