FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the disease of alcoholism and the problems of alcohol abuse constitutes the primary health problems of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, preventative efforts in the form of community education on alternatives to the alcoholic life style and alcoholic patterns of drinking are critical elements in the long-range approach to decreasing the problems of alcoholism and alcohol abuse.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares August 15 through 21, 1982, as White Mountain Apache Alcohol Awareness Week.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it declares its support on the efforts of the White Mountain Alcohol and Substance Abuse Task Force to institute a Reservation-wide effort to educate communities to these issues during this week.

The foregoing resolution was on August 13, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
