

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

FOR THE EXCLUSION AND REMOVAL OF BAKER HARDIN, JR.

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been presented with the following allegations made by the Tribal Attorney that:

- (1) Baker Hardin, Jr., a non-member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is the son of Baker and Cerita Hardin who are lessees of Lot B-83 and B-91 at Hawley Lake;
- (2) Baker Hardin, Jr. resides in one of the two Lots B-83 leased to Baker and Cerita D. Hardin;
- (3) Baker Hardin, Jr. has been convicted in Federal District Court on February 16, 1982 for concealment of stolen property involving solar panels, batteries, and supporters belonging to McKay's Peak Observatory;
 - (a) Baker Hardin, Jr. concealed these stolen items on the Hawley Lake Lots B-83 and B-91 leased to Mr. & Mrs. Baker Hardin, Sr.;
 - (b) The concealment of these stolen items violates Tribal Law and Order Code Ordinance 52.50;
- (4) Baker Hardin, Jr. has displayed signs belonging to the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Game and Fish Department on the house situated on Lot B-83 at Hawley Lake;
 - (a) These signs could only be stolen property from the White Mountain Apache Tribe;
 - (b) Receipt of stolen goods is a violation under the Tribal Law & Order Code Ordinance 52.50;
 - (c) Baker Hardin, Jr. knew or should have known that he has exhibited these signs without the consent and permission of the White Mountain Apache Tribe;
- (5) Baker Hardin, Jr. has been cited for "making wood" on the White Mountain Apache Reservation under Section 73.25-13 of Ordinance 111 of the White Mountain Apache Game and Fish Code;

- (6) Baker Hardin, Jr. has disturbed the peace by holding large parties on the Hawley Lake Lot B-83, necessitating Tribal police action to abate the same;
- (7) The aforementioned actions are grounds for exclusion or removal by the White Mountain Apache Tribe, under Tribal Ordinance No. 128, § 1001 (b), 1002 (2), (a) and (g), and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Baker Hardin, Jr.'s continued presence on the Reservation constitutes a danger to the real and personal property and/or to the safety and welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has authority pursuant to Ordinance No. 128, Section 1005 to direct the Tribal Chairman or Vice-Chairman to Petition the Tribal Court for a Notice of Exclusion or Removal of a non-member pursuant to enumerated grounds set forth in §§ 1002 of Ordinance 128, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Baker Hardin, Jr. has engaged in acts which constitute a basis by which he may be excluded and removed from the Reservation pursuant to Ordinance 128,

BE IT RESOLVED BY the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Chairman to forthwith petition the Tribal Court for a Notice of Exclusion or Removal of Baker Hardin, Jr., a non-member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the procedure set forth in Ordinance 128.

The foregoing resolution was on Sept. 08, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1, (q) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act on June 18, 1934 (48 stat. 984).
