

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Vice-Chairman, Reno Johnson, has given a report to the Tribal Council regarding the progress being made to establish a Veterinarian Program for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation which the Tribal Council by previous Resolution No. 82-205 endorsed, and

WHEREAS, Vice-Chairman, Reno Johnson reports to the Tribal Council that he has held three meetings with interested parties and effected parties since August 19, 1982, the date Resolution No. 82-205 was passed, and now comes before the Tribal Council to seek their opinion as to whether they desire a full-time veterinarian or a part-time veterinarian for the reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the reservation needs a full-time veterinarian and that sources of financial assistance should be explored by the Vice-Chairman for that purpose, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the further opinion that the position for a full-time veterinarian should be adequately planned for in terms of financial, staffing, transportation and equipment needs, and that the Vice-Chairman should seek technical advice regarding those aspects of the proposed Veterinarian Program, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that the Chairman's Administrative Assistant, Charles O'Hara, has a background in planning and grants and; therefore, should be consulted regarding the Veterinarian Program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recommends to the Vice-Chairman, Reno Johnson, that he continue to plan for a full-time Veterinarian Program for the Reservation and that he seek technical advice in the planning of this program in terms of necessary financial assistance, staff and equipment needs from Charles O'Hara and report back to the Tribal Council as soon as he has been able to develop a more detailed plan for the Veterinarian Program.

The foregoing resolution was on November 09, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
