WHEREAS, Van Manuel and Ida Manuel, tribal members and community members of the Carrizo Community with the people of said community have requested the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for \$500.00 of the Land Claims Recreation funds to sponsor a Basketball Tournament, and


WHEREAS, the proceeds of this Basketball Tournament will be used to defray the costs of student activities of the John F. Kennedy Day School in the Community of Cedar Creek, and

WHEREAS, funds for these activities have been explored and are not available from any other source.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request of the Carrizo Community people, by petition, for the expenditure of not to exceed \$500.00 of the Land Claims Recreation funds for the above purpose.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
