RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Homer Beatty, Tribal member, has come before the Tribal Council on behalf of his daughter, Faith Beatty and Glenda Harvey, both students at Alchesay High School for the purpose of requesting financial assistance for these two (2) students' trip to Washington, D. C. in January, 1983, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by Adam Lupe, a member of the School Board for Alchesay High School that the school will pay the round trip transportation for the students, but the students need other monies for personal needs and necessities in order to partake any planned activities in Washington, D. C., and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council concludes that Mr. Beatty's request is justified and that the two (2) students have no other source of financial assistance in order to travel to Washington, D. C. and to participate in the planned activities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby request that the Tribal Chairman and the Tribal Administrative Manager meet as soon as possible and allocate such money to these two (2) students for their necessary expenses during their stay in Washington, D. C.; the source of the money allocated to come from Public Relations monies budgeted either by the Tribal Chairman's Office or both, or any other available source of funding be explored for this request.

The foregoing resolution was on January 13, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
