

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to providing quality behavioral health and social services for its members, and
- WHEREAS, the vitality and cohesiveness of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is build upon the strength of its component family units, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that therapuetic counseling services to trouble Apache families will further strengthen the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Child Welfare Act, P. L. 95-698, Title II, provides for the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, to provide grants to tribes for said tribes to provide such services, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman to negotiate and execute such grants and/or any amendments, and
- WHEREAS, the authority granted under this resolution to the Tribal Chairman is to run concurrent with the term of the grant.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it requests from the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, a grant to provide services to families under the Indian Child Welfare Act funds, entitled the Families at Risk Program for purposes set forth in this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grant is to commence on July 1, 1983 and is to be administered by the Tribal Guidance Center.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all grant documents and/or any amendments thereto necessary to consummate said grant or grants.


