RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, at a previous meeting, established Road Construction Priorities embodied in Resolution No. 83-294, and
- WHEREAS, said resolution provides for changes and updates of that priority listing, and
- WHEREAS, Item No. 7, Upper Cibecue Bridge on the priority listing is sorely needed by the Cibecue residents that will utilize this bridge, and
- WHEREAS, a bridge would be used by fifteen families who must walk more than three miles in order to reach commercial and community services center in Cibecue during inclement weather, and
- WHEREAS, said bridge to be constructed will be a pedestrian foot bridge to enable the fifteen families who must now go out of their way, three miles, in order to reach commercial and community services center in Cibecue.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Road Construction Priorities listing under Resolution No. 82-294 as Item No. 7, Upper Cibecue Bridge be changed to read, "No. 1., Cibecue Pedestrian Foot Bridge".
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that this bridge be located in the area commonly known as George Gregg Crossing to provide better access to the residents utilizing the foot bridge.

The foregoing resolution was on March 02, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
