RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been invited by the Department of Housing and Urban Development to submit an application for a grant to fund certain eligible Indian Community Development Block Grant activities; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that the following projects represent the current priorities in the order listed:
 - 1. A cattle feedlot facility to be operated by the White Mountain Apache Agriculture Enterprise as a component of the Canyon Day Irrigation Project;
 - 2. A solid waste treatment facility; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has satisfied and will continue to adhere to the requirement of 24 CFR 571.604 concerning citizen participation as follows:
 - 1. Follow a citizen participation plan that provides tribal citizens with information as to the Community Development Block Grant Program, and allows expression of views in choice of objectives; and
 - Follow traditional tribal means of citizen involvement that meet the standards outlined in Subpart H; and
- WHEREAS, in connection with this application to HUD, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is asked to make certain assurances hereinafter resolved.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe:

- 1. That the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign documents and otherwise act to complete a grant agreement with HUD.
- 2. That to the best of its knowledge and ability, the reservation population and poverty level data to be submitted with the application are accurate.
- 3. That the profits which should accrue from the Feedlot Project become available, they will be retained within the Agriculture Enterprise to insure the long-term economic viability of the project, including the further development of irrigated cropland and restoration of rangeland; thus serving the tribal goal of self-sufficiency through a stable and profitable agricultural economic base.
