


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has previously passed Ordinances No. 131, 132, 133 and 134, and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe require that said ordinances be signed and delivered to the Bureau of Indian Affairs within ten (10) days after they have been enacted by the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, more than ten days has transpired regarding these ordinances which pertain to Ordinance No. 131, TOWING; Ordinance No. 132, SUNRISE TRESPASS: Ordinance No. 133, ABANDONED VEHICLES: Ordinance No. 134, EXCLUSIVE TRIBAL COURT JURISDICTION, and
- WHEREAS, said ordinances were not delivered to the Bureau of Indian Affairs within the ten-day requirement, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered the reasons for reaffirming the above-listed ordinances.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby reaffirms Ordinances No. 131, 132, 133 and 134, effective immediately.


