

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been addressed by Bruce Moody, a tribal member, regarding his grave need for a house for his shelter and protection, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the letter of testimony received from the Pastor of the East Fork Mission describing Bruce Moody's particular needs and the conditions under which he has been forced to live as well as the unfair advantage others have taken of him due to his handicapped condition which could be alleviated by a house being provided him, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that the needy handicapped should be given priority for Home Improvement Housing Program housing, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council directs that Hal Butler, General Manager for Fort Apache Timber Company, be contacted for lumber and Tribal Work Experience Program and others contacted for labor assistance for the construction of a house for Bruce Moody.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants extraordinary priority for Home Improvement Housing for Bruce Moody due to his great need and handicap.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests Hal Butler, General Manager for Fort Apache Timber Company be contacted for lumber and Tribal Work Experience Program contacted for labor assistance to construct a Home Improvement Program house for Bruce Moody at the earliest possible time.

The foregoing resolution was on August 03, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
